Conference Course Details

While we're excited about the conference location, we're proud of the courses and speakers we have to offer this year. Continuing our tradition of offering high-caliber speakers and topics you can take back to your practice, our theme of **Fit For Life** will be the highlight of the conference!

Our course presenters, in alphabetical order:



Granville York Brady Jr., Au.D.
Fellow American Academy of Audiology, CCC-SLP/A

Dr. Brady earned his Au.D. at Arizona School of Health Sciences. He is a licensed audiologist and speech-language pathologist. For the past 27 years, he has maintained a private practice with offices in Clifton and East Brunswick, NJ. Dr. Brady teaches business development and accounting at A.T. Still University. In addition to his clinical experience, Dr. Brady has served as council president and finance chairman for the Borough of Somerville, NJ and was responsible for the budget, insurance and retirement operations of the municipality. He served as treasurer of the Audiology Foundation of America.

Dr. Brady's course, "On Ramps & Off Ramps:" Buying and selling a Hearing Health Care Practice will identify the tasks needed to prepare a hearing aid practice for sale. Included will be a discussion of the methods to evaluate the practice by asset value, liquidation value, comparables or "comps," and income multiple formulas. Several business cases will be analyzed to determine their value and a sample prospectus will be offered for those who wish to use it as a model.



Patricia Kricos, PhD
University of Florida

Dr. Kricos is Professor of Audiology at the University of Florida, where she has taught in the audiology program since 1981. Her major clinical and research interests are in audiology rehabilitation with adults. Dr. Kricos has published a number of articles and chapters on audiology rehabilitation and co-edited a book with Sharon Lesner, *Audiologic Rehabilitation of Older Adults: A Practical Approach*. Dr. Kricos is Past-President of the Academy of Rehabilitative Audiology and President of the American Academy of Audiology. She also serves on the Advisory Council of the Better Hearing Institute.

Dr. Kricos will be presenting two courses at the conference. Meeting the Unique Listening and Hearing Needs of Older Adults Will focus on the unique needs of older adults with listening difficulties. Factors contributing to their listening challenges will be described with main focus on evaluation/treatment options to help older adults effectively manage their hearing difficulties. The Road to Blissful Hearing Aid Satisfaction will focus on the impact of untreated hearing loss in older individuals. The focus of this presentation will be to address the causes of low hearing aid uptake, to provide suggestions for eliminating or at least minimizing many of the issues related to poor market penetration, and to recommend strategies for reducing the discontinued use of hearing aids.

Legislative Action

Board Consolidation: In the last issue of the Earfull, and at the November General Membership Meeting we discussed the important issue of New Jersey's proposal to have the Audiology and Speech Pathology Advisory Committee take over the duties of the Hearing Aid Dispensers Examining Committee. The Association vehemently opposes this notion that the Speech/Audiology board would be able to oversee those that dispense hearing aids. The issue is complex, and the Association has drafted a response to the proposal with the help of our new executive/legislative partners at ABS. Libby Vinson has reached out to the Assemblywoman on behalf of the Association to assure her that we support such consumer protection. We look forward to having a long alliance with her and many other legislators who support the causes that are important to us and our practices. 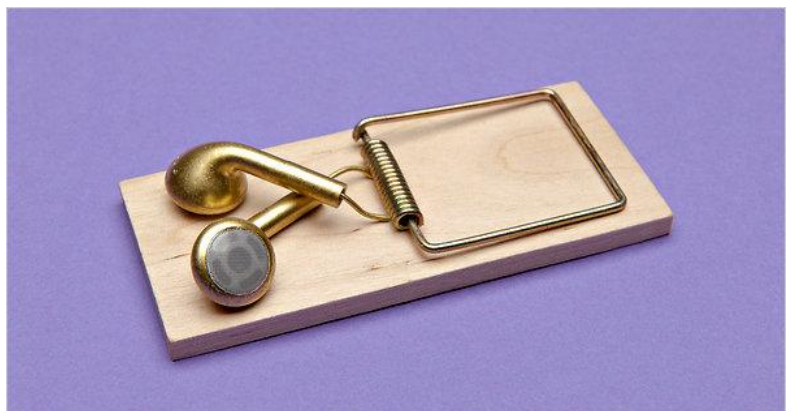

- **Resident of New Jersey**
- **A letter from parents indicating the need of financial help for scholarship tuition money.**

-Guidelines for candidacy: Hearing Aids

- **Letter from parents indicating the need of financial help for hearing aids.**
- **Young person of school age.**
- **Fund will pay invoice cost after all discounts from any manufacturer.**
- **Manufacturer will be asked prior to billing if they would consider the donation of hearing aids to that young person**
- **Young person must not qualify for other third party programs, such as Medicaid, Childrens Special Health Services, where funding is available for the purchase of hearing aids. Explanation is needed for child's being unqualified for funding from state programs.**
- **Office doing fitting, audiologist or hearing aid specialist does not receive compensation for fitting services from any source or profit from the sale of hearing aid.**

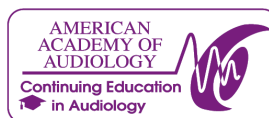
